The Medicine Bag

Grandpa's Point of View Monologue

The "Medicine Bag" is a very interesting tradition that is held in a Lakota family. It is passed down to every male of the family to keep the tradition alive and flowing. Inside the medicine bag there are pieces of sacred sages of each male that have warned it. The sacred sage must be from the reservation that the elder or Lakota family came from. You must not wear the medicine bag until you are in the reservation and have put a sacred sage in the bag. When you do you should wear it around your neck, for it is said that it shall keep you safe from unhappy days and harms way.

I was going out of the reservation because I wanted to go find my family. They always visited me but when they left I felt lonely and sad. I always wished they could stay, for I cannot feel that way. So I decided to go out and travel to find them. I wanted to see where my family lived and what their home is like because they were the only ones I have left. So I packed some stuff and I put some money in my boots for my family to make my funeral when I had passed on.
