Full of Life

There are a total of nineteen islands in the Galapagos Islands. They are located in the Pacific Ocean, about 1,000 kilometers (600 mi.) west of Ecuador. The Galapagos are rocky and dry. This creates a harsh environment, or surrounding. Still, the islands support life. Thousands of different kinds of animals live here. In fact, some of these animals aren't found anywhere else on Earth!

Every animal on the Galapagos has adapted to its special environment. For example, the marine iguana dives into the water to get food. It's the only type of lizard that does this. The cormorant is a bird that can't fly. However, it has webbed feet and its small wings act like flippers so it can "swim" under water for food.

There are many other kinds of birds on the islands. Penguins and finches are the most common. The islands are home to thirteen types of finches. Each type has a different food source. This allows all finches to eat without having to compete with each other for food.
